# Who wants fast Internet?

Minnesota and our federal government have allocated billions of dollars this year to improve broadband infrastructure, with a special emphasis on rural communities. That money will be spent somewhere.

## *Why not here?*

In deciding where to spend these funds, Internet service providers (ISPs) and funding agencies want to see a demonstrated interest of potential customers to pay for the improved Internet service (at regular rates). That's where you and the Koochiching Technology Initiative come in.

KTI has identified five priority areas which do not have high speed Internet (25Mbps download or better) but do have enough potential customers per square mile to make broadband economically viable for the ISPs and supplemental funding.

Paul Bunyan Communications has agreed to host online surveys to measure the local demand. If the interest is strong, KTI and its ISP partners will use the results to attract federal and state dollars.
